### The Mission of Cross of Hope Faith Connections Groups...

To provide an opportunity for all people

To share Christ's love and authentic community

In a small group setting where lives are transformed through growth in faith and service to others.

#### Rocky Mountain Synod Council

**Composition:** The Synod Council has twenty-one members; the four synod officers; one from each of the ten RMS Conferences; and seven at-large positions (one each for lay male, lay female, rostered leader, youth, young adult (18-30 years old), and two from ethnic-specific congregations). Terms are four years except for the Bishop (six years) and the youth members (elected in even-numbered years for a term of two years). Terms are limited to two consecutive terms.

**Description:** The Synod Council shall be the board of directors of the Synod and shall serve as its interim legislative authority between meetings of the Synod Assembly. It may make decisions which are not in conflict with actions taken by the Synod Assembly, or which are not precluded by provisions of the constitution and bylaws of the Rocky Mountain Synod or the ELCA. The council normally meets monthly via Zoom with in-person meetings three times per year. Other functions are set forth in the RMS Constitution (S10.03).

# **Ruth Franz**

Birthdate: August 14,1923

Birthplace: Strasbourg, France

Married: July 14, 1943

**Occupation:** Homemaker, Secretary

**Hobbies:** Visiting, reading, short walks; in years past – painting, quilting, sewing, knitting, crocheting, gardening

You may know Ruth. Maybe you have seen her at Sunday service sitting with her family – Jan and Pete Wormwood and John and Sue McWilliam.

Can you believe she will be 100 years old next year!

Ruth was born to Martin and Lydia Strasen. Her father graduated from Concordia College in Milwaukee, WI. As a new minister, he agreed to serve overseas. His first call was to Strasbourg, France, located on the border with Germany. Lydia, Martin's sweetheart, stayed back in Milwaukee. After a year, Lydia went to France where she and Martin were married. They lived there for ten years – long enough to build a church.

Martin and Lydia had four children (two girls and two boys) – Ruth being the oldest.

Things were tough after World War I. Nevertheless, Ruth had some good memories of her time there as a small child. Her father travelled to many little villages on a motorcycle. In these small villages a band woke up the people to tell them it was time to go to church. In a time of need, the local Catholic church had a lot of communion wafers, which they shared with the locals.

Martin and Lydia returned to Milwaukee due to health issues Martin was having. Now they were close to Ruth's grandparents. When Ruth was 13 years old, her mother, Lydia, passed away. Martin remarried and had two more children. Martin was a guest speaker at many churches. He served in Brazil and taught at Concordia College.

Ruth met her husband, Raymond, in Milwaukee at church (of course). He was in the Army Air Corp during World War II. They had four children (two girls, Janet and Susan, and two boys, Paul and Mark). Janet was born in Hobbs, NM and Susan in Milwaukee, WI.

Ray had various jobs, which meant they lived in different places. A friend of Ray's brought him to Muleshoe, TX to be the manager of the Chamber of Commerce. He continued to work for various Chambers – from Portales to Santa Fe and back to Portales.

Ruth was the secretary to the Superintendent of Schools in Portales. When they became computerized, Ruth recalled spending her lunch period learning how to work the computer.

In Portales, they would have Sunday night supper for Lutheran students attending Eastern New Mexico University.

Ray and Ruth were always involved in their church – Ray playing the organ and as the choir director; Ruth singing in the choirs and teaching Sunday School in every church where they lived.

With Janet and Sue living in Albuquerque, Ruth and Ray retired and were convinced to move here, too. When they came to Cross of Hope, Ray was involved with GOLF – Greater Order of Lutheran Fellowship, which meant they golfed following men's bible study on Tuesday mornings. Ray also became the choir director and Pastor Dale Bauer said he had a place for Ruth. She became the "Membership Secretary". All the records - births, baptisms, confirmations, marriages and deaths - were kept in a "Big Red Book".

Since Ray was the church organist and choir director, Ruth and the children sang in the choir. Like the bands in France when Ruth was a child, this was a way to make sure you were in church on Sunday morning. A singing and musical family (all the children played an instrument). Does it remind you of another family?

Ray died in 1994. Jan recalled it was a Thursday night – and she had choir practice. Needless to say, she didn't have choir practice that night!

Ruth had a grand time reminiscing a life well lived. Hopefully one day COVID will be behind us and you will see Ruth in her usual place with her family at Sunday service. For some younger members you might ask her about those years in France between the WWI and WWII. Hearing about personal experiences during these challenging times is well worth your time.





# **COH HOSTING: March 13-20**

Currently, there are three families with a total of nine people, (3 adults, and 6 children ages 4-15). A newborn expected 2/28!! There are NO anticipated family graduations soon. The families <u>will be</u> <u>sheltering in a New location</u>: <u>Montgomery Church of Christ</u>, <u>Parsonage</u> at 7201 Montgomery Blvd. NE 87109. We formerly hosted, in our building, 2 weeks concurrently, and now we host one week at a time, four months apart.

The Family Promise (FP) board has prioritized forward movement with renovations of the San Pedro site that will lead to Certificate of Occupancy ASAP. However, there have been supply and other delays for many reasons related to Covid.

We thank you for your gracious and generous support of the Families who would otherwise be homeless. Instead, they are safely supported through a very difficult time.

Lois and Jan are so very grateful for your generous gifts of time, money, food, household items, and of course your prayers. **Together**, WE MAKE a DIFFERENCE in the lives of all of the children served

because their families are able to survive the stress of near homelessness.


There are so many little things you can do in this world to make it a better place. Always remember that you have a helper on your journey. The Lord is always with you, spring, summer, fall or winter.

#### The Five Wounds : Kristin Valdez Quade ( a novel)

It's Holy Week in Las Penas, Mexico, and thirty-three-year-old unemployed Amadeo Padilla has been given the part of Jesus in the Good Friday procession. He is preparing feverishly for this role when his fifteen-year-old daughter Angel shows up pregnant on his doorstep and disrupts his plans for personal redemption. With weeks to go until her due date, tough, ebullient Angel has fled her mother's house, setting her life on a startling new path.

#### Led by Faith : Rising from the Ashes of the Rwandan Genocide - Immaculee Ilibagiza

As a young university student, she miraculously survived the savage killing spree that left most of her family and friends, and more than a million of her fellow citizens, dead. As hundreds of killers hunted for her, Immaculee formed a profound and transforming relationship with God that transcended the bloodshed and butchery - a relationship that enabled her to emerge from the slaughter with a spirit purged of hatred and a heart brimming with forgiveness.

#### God Has a Dream: A Vision of Hope in Our Time - Desmond Tutu

Tutu; "Many of us can acknowledge that God cares about the world but can't imagine that God would care about you or me individually. But our God marvelously, miraculously cares about each and every one of us. The Bible has this incredible image of you, of me, of all of us, each one, held as something precious, fragile in the palms of God's hands. And that you and I exist only because God is forever blowing God's breath into our being."
