School Update:

- As I mentioned last month, the School Ministry team has made some hires. Lets put names to those new hires: Linda Aragon— 1st grade; Natasha Natewa— 2nd grade; Jade Gilmore— Preschool Educational Assistant. Their start date is August 5, 2024 along with the returning teachers. Their salaries are within budget. Other positions have been interviewed for and additional hires have been made. 

You have met Sydney's mother. You know the old saying, "The leaf doesn't fall far from the tree." At the young age of 22, Sydney is also very accomplished. Sydney graduated from Cottonwood Classical Preparatory School with her high school diploma and an International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma. She received a "full ride" scholarship to the University of New Mexico. Are you blown away yet? There is more.

She finished high school in the 10th grade and then focused the rest of her high school career on earning her IB Diploma! She currently attends the University of New Mexico full-time and is in her last year of her undergraduate degree (B.S.) in Emergency Medical Services with a minor in Chemistry. Sydney graduated last August as the Valedictorian from the Paramedic Academy at UNM. This was a one-year program within her undergraduate degree program at UNM in the Department of Emergency Medicine. After passing all the state and national exams, she is a fully licensed paramedic. Sydney is currently finishing up her pre-med classes and will be applying to medical school once she graduates in December of 2024 from the University of New Mexico.

Sydney said she was always interested in medicine. When she first watched Grey's Anatomy she was hooked. After watching an episode, she went to the computer and did further research on the cases that were highlighted on the show. She was always interested in helping people and learning new things. When Sydney was in high school, she went to Camp Neuro, a summer program at the University of New Mexico. The mission was to inspire high school students to go into medicine. They hit their target with Sydney! At Camp Neuro, a representative from the University of New Mexico came and spoke to the students about the EMS (Emergency Medical Services) program offered at the university. There are only a handful of colleges in the country that offer a B.S. in Emergency Medical Services. She plans on continuing to work in emergency medicine by becoming an ER (Emergency Room) doctor or potentially an EMS physician. This is what Sydney has wanted since she was 15 years old. How nice to have one of our own becoming a doctor!

Sydney spoke proudly about her parents and her grandparents being an influence in her life. They influenced her work ethic and told her to "chase her dreams." Her grandparents helped "mold her."

During her early years, her grandparents served as her caregivers while her parents worked full-time, offering support from early childhood through elementary and middle school. Their presence was especially notable during her time at Cross of Hope Elementary.

Both of Sydney's parents were/are high school counselors. Her dad, Robert, is a counselor at Rio Grande High School. Sydney has one brother, Emilio, who is currently attending his first year at the University of New Mexico.

Sydney is active in the Cross of Hope Praise +Team. When we were without a director for a while, Sydney stepped up and filled in. From what I have heard and observed, she is always willing to help where she is needed. In addition, her smooth and mellow voice sings with joy every Sunday.

Like her mother, Sydney enjoys sports. While Shannon played basketball and softball, Sydney was more passionate about playing basketball in high school. Sydney was a five-year Varsity player and a four-year letterman at Cottonwood Classical Preparatory School. Sydney also participated in track and field for two years as a thrower where she also lettered. Now she enjoys watching basketball on TV during her spare time.

If you don't know either of these two amazing women, it would be well worth your while to take a moment to engage with them. They both have – and will continue to accomplish great things in their lives – serving the community and our church members by using their gifts. We sure are blessed to have them.
