BUDGET: The majority of our meeting on July 23, 2024 was review and approval of the 2024/2025 budget. The budget will be presented to the congregation at the congregational meeting, August 25, 2024. DID YOU CATCH THAT?

Congregational meeting on August 25, 2024. There will be ONE 10:00 AM service, followed by the meeting, followed by a fellowship potluck. Join us on this date! REMINDER: No outdoor services on August 25, 2024.

School Update:

- A. **Enrollment:** as of July 23, 2024: 33 preschool students with five additional processing registration 46 elementary students with four additional processing registration.
- B. **Staff:** We have seven new individuals on staff. Preschool EA Jade Gilmore; Kindergarten Angela Durham; 1st grade Linda Aragon; 2nd grade Natasha Van Scyoc; Art/Librarian Lisa White; Math Intervention Paula Willis; EA/Lunch Lelani Dixon. All teachers return on August 5, 2024. New Hires will attend various trainings regarding policies and safety procedures throughout that first week. School begins August 12, 2024.
- C. Shade structure has been ordered and is currently being constructed in Texas due to its size. Installation is planned for September.

Safety/Security

- A. Western States and Summit Security conducted annual fire alarm/fire extinguisher/sprinkler/back flow installation inspections July 10, 2024. Replacement of 14 fire extinguishers due to end of life (6 year) expiration was completed July 24, 2024.
- B. Lockdown buckets have been cleaned and updated as necessary.
- C. Tinting of several doors/windows will occur by end of the month.

Susan was born to Oscar and Shirley Gonzalez. Her dad immigrated to the U.S. from Mexico at the age of 12. He became a probation officer in San Bernardino, CA and held that job for 42 years. Susan's mother worked at the VA hospital in a variety of positions. Her parents were staunch Catholics and provided Susan with a firm faith foundation. Susan has one sister, Virg, who is older and lives in Sacramento, CA.

Susan was always close to her grandparents. One set lived next door to the family. The joy that this provided gave Susan the desire to have a similar relationship with her grandchildren.

When Susan was a junior in high school, she was awarded an Interact scholarship through Rotary. This was back in 1981 and the "Rotary Life Scholar" program had just started. (Interesting how things of the past come back into your life in some way. I told Susan it was Rotary who gave the first individual computers to the school.) She went to Japan for five weeks. Susan went on to college at California State University (Cal State) to study Business Administration. She floundered for two years and decided to quit.

She met her husband, Tomas Rivera, and married in September 1986. Tomas was in the Air Force and they relocated to Denver, CO in 1987. He was a "Ports of Call" Flight Engineer, (a person who consults with the ship's captain during the docking or undocking when entering or departing a confined waterway). He was working on his commercial pilot's license.

Susan's son Jacob was born in Nov. 1988 and Aaron arrived in Apr. 1991. During this time Susan was a stay-athome mom. She home schooled her boys. Susan and Tomas divorced in June of 1995.

Susan decided to go back to school attending the University of Northern Colorado. She graduated Suma cum Laude in December 1999 (on her birthday – what a gift!) with a BA in Human Communication, and a license in Elementary Education. She said walking for graduation "was such a joy."



In August 2000, Susan started teaching for the Aurora Public Schools in K – 5 grades. Second grade was her favorite. She found she really loved teaching. COVID hit in 2020! Online school was not for her. Out of 29 children, 12 showed up.

Her son Jake announced he and his family were moving to Albuquerque. He was a campus minister for "Navigators" (a ministry that shares the gospel of Jesus and helps people grow their relationship with Him through "Life to Life® discipleship.) in Greeley CO and was reassigned to UNM. She "tagged along" because of the grandma role she wanted to create. Jake has been very supportive and told her, "You can do anything. God will equip you to do it."

She attended New City Church which had an in-service worship. A lady introduced herself and said her daughter was trying to do online learning with her children and was struggling. They asked Susan to be a nanny to the children and help with the learning. What a blessing that turned out to be. They included her in their family. Additionally, she became a member of Albuquerque Newcomers Club. She met some like-minded women she could go hiking with.

At the end of the year, the children were going back to in-person school and Susan returned to the question of what to do. At the time, Susan lived in the apartments around the corner from Cross of Hope. She would take walks at Mariposa Park and noticed a sign looking for teachers. (I heard a similar story from Linda Willoughby. I think we should always put signs up in those apartments.) The timing couldn't have been better. Susan became our kindergarten teacher and realized she was meant to teach. She never knew teaching could be so wonderful. Nothing is as amazing as being here at Cross of Hope.

When Debra Alba (our former Director of School Ministry) resigned Nancy Lacher asked if Susan had given any thought to taking Debra's place. Of course, Susan's first reaction was "no!" She then talked to her son, Jake, who gives her wise counsel. He told her, "Mom, you have had many assignments in your life, but this is your calling." Three years had passed since her move to Albuquerque, and she had multiple jobs to make ends meet. She tutored with Tutor Doctor and had been involved in "Apartment Life Ministry" whose purpose was to "radically transform apartment living by making Christ known." (Their website states they help apartment owners care for the residents by connecting them in meaningful relationships.) She was the Community Coordinator, which meant she would organize events for the apartment community twice a month and love on residents. There she met some wonderful people but knew if she became the school Director, she could no longer do both jobs.

Susan accepted the Director's position and resigned her other job. She finally found a cute little farmhouse and moved to Corrales in March 2024. She enjoys being close to the Bosque where

she can walk and enjoy the quiet of nature. Susan describes this transition as going from "super busy" to truly be the MeMa" (grandma) she wants to be. She "finds peace which will overflow into service for others." She feels she has the "opportunity to make an impact – I can truly represent Christ and love from a place of peace and not work. This is where God wants me to be." She has

"learned a lot in the last year and is excited to continue learning and see how God will use me in this role. I now have the opportunity to live a

generous life."

Susan's son Jake is now the Youth Pastor at New City Church, where both she and her family attend. He graciously allows Susan to spend as much time with his four children as she wants, which is as often as she can! Not to have forgotten Aaron, he lives and works in Colorado as a lead floor manager with California Closets. Aaron studied Linguistics, translates in Japanese, and hopes to return to school to get his master's degree - maybe even a doctorate in Linguistics. He is a fabulous dad to his three "fur babies," sings with the Colorado Choir and loves musicals (Manga), and playing video games. Since Aaron is not married and has no children the decision to move to Albuquerque with Jake and his family was easy.



You can tell that Susan is having a good time and is enjoying life. She spreads her joy throughout our school. If you happen to be around when school is in session, take a moment to meet Susan and experience how she is working to make Cross of Hope School a happy place for children to be and grow. Cross of Hope is thankful for your energy, thoughtfulness and joy.
