School is in full swing. We have several new teachers who have yet to be introduced to you. Each comes to us with years of experience and a desire to be in a faith-led environment. We are lucky to have them. If you have the opportunity, come to chapel on Wednesday at 2:30pm, say "hello" and introduce yourself. It doesn't matter if your child is in their class or if you have a child in our school or just want to know what is going on.



Meet Angela Durham. She teaches kindergarten. She taught in the Albuquerque Public School system moving through grades K to 8. Her last assignment was at Navajo Elementary.

Angela retired from teaching but her friend, Linda, (whom you will meet next) invited her to apply at Cross of Hope. Angela was prompted by her sense of curiosity. She wanted to know how teaching at a "church school" would be different from APS. Additionally, she wanted to enhance her own faith. As you know, "God" or prayer cannot be mentioned in a public school. The children in the public school system had no idea what holidays meant other than a day off.

Additionally, she mentioned that she "forgot how to be kid." At Cross of Hope it is nice to be creative again; not just teaching for a test. "It is not just a job." Angela is glad to be at Cross of Hope. She has been able to "reaffirm her faith" which is important to her.

Linda Aragon is our first grade teacher. Linda taught in the APS system in the first through third grades until just before COVID. She was having health scares so took a medical leave of absence. She occupied her time (and got healthy) taking care of her five-month-old granddaughter. The latter's parents were both teachers and were busy adapting to COVID changes.

Linda decided to come back to teaching when she saw an email regarding jobs available at Cross of Hope. She loves the challenge of teaching the children and the reward that follows when they get it. She loves working with kids – to watch them grow and become confident. Linda says she really loves first grade and is happy to be at Cross of Hope.

When her grandma died in October 2022 she decided to move to Albuquerque in 2023. She was at Abundant Life Christian School and taught fifth through seventh grades focusing on literature, Bible and also PE. Natasha experienced the change from a small community to a big city. They both have their positives and negatives. Cross of Hope reminds her of her time on the pueblo.

Natasha saw the ad for a teacher on-line. She loves the kids. It is nice to see their growth. She describes her kids as "bright." Some of them think like the fifth graders she had. She said the atmosphere here is "servant oriented" and nurtures the kids to solve their own problems. Natasha is glad she found Cross of Hope.





# The Happy Hope-r John and Nancy Lacher

We are all used to seeing John and Nancy around Cross of Hope doing something important to help all of us. Like what you ask? John keeps our precious copiers and printers running, producing beautiful documents or keeping the north side of the church gardens looking fabulous. Nancy is always helping to guide the school in different ways, including teaching when we were short a teacher or leading the youth group. She has served on the church council and will serve as an assisting minister, when asked. I can only think we would be in a pickle without these two valuable church members.

So, wouldn't you like to learn a little more about both of these gifted members?

Nancy was one of five girls born to Wilbur and Alma (Meyer) Klattenhoff. Wilbur was a Lutheran pastor in Carlsbad, NM. When Nancy was two years old, they moved to Albuquerque when Wilbur started Christ Lutheran Church on the east side of town. Nancy's sisters are spread around but are still close by. One sister, Carol, is in Albuquerque, Susan in Las Cruces, Linda in El Paso (with her family in Las Cruces) and Kay in Taos. Nancy refers to herself and her sisters as "free-range children."

Nancy always enjoyed children and wanted to be a teacher. She graduated from the University of New Mexico with a B.S. in Education in 1979. Later ,she went on for an M.S. in Special Education earning her degree in 1983. Then came the Ed.D. (Doctor of Education) in 1990.

Nancy's teaching career began at Monte Vista Elementary School in the Nob Hill area. She retired from Seven Bar Elementary School on the west side in 2015. She racked up a total of 35 years in the education field with 15 years as a teacher and 20 years as a principal. Now she is enjoying retirement and keeping busy with Cross of Hope activities and playing with her "fur babies." This includes two horses, Gunner and Oakley, and two donkeys, Pancho and Lefty. She and John share two rescue labs, Butch Cassidy and Sundance Kid.

Now to learn more about John. His father, Larry, was an Episcopal minister in Baltimore, MD. His mother, Katharine was a teacher. John has two brothers – Billy has passed away, and Tom, lives in Atlanta, GA.

As was the situation when John was a young man, he entered the Air Force (before he would be drafted which meant no choice but the Army). He spent one year in Thailand followed by Tacoma, WA and his final station was Albuquerque. He worked as an aircraft mechanic. When he was discharged, he returned home to Baltimore. He spent a little more than four years there and worked for a copier company. He returned to Albuquerque and got a job with Xerox. At the time they were BIG in the copier business. He stayed with them for nine years and then started his own copier business. When technology was antiquating copiers, John decided it was time to close his business after 25 years and retire.

John is the type of person who likes to keep busy. Cross of Hope helps him do that. When he closed his business, John donated a Xerox 9500 copier (name "The Unknown Soldier") to the church. It has been ten years and he keeps "The Unknown Soldier" running. He also takes care of the lights and the north side garden. John does enjoy cars along with his BMW K1600 motorcycle.

John and Nancy met while Nancy was working part-time at Sears while attending college years. Somehow Nancy managed to break the copier! John to the rescue! He came to repair the copier. "The rest is history." Now you might wonder, "Does Nancy know more about copiers? or "Does John keep her as far away from copiers as possible?" You'll have to ask them yourself.

John and Nancy are a fun couple with wonderful senses of humor. If you haven't met them, it is worth your time or at least you can say "thanks" for all they do at Cross of Hope to keep us running smoothly.

Cross of Hope should be cared for in a way that demonstrates its sacred nature and purpose. Members share the responsibility to keep the property and grounds clean, orderly, and everything in working order. We are also asked to assume a greater responsibility for Church cleaning and care.

We are always looking for volunteers to fix small property problems in the Church and School. It would be a blessing to be able to call a volunteer for help before we have to call one of our vendors, usually at a high cost.

If you have experience in plumbing, carpentry, painting, cleaning, we would love to have you spend a little of your time volunteering to help us when we need help fixing something.



#### Some examples are:

- Fixing leaks in toilets, faucets, sinks, dishwasher, etc.
- Repairing broken items such as tables, chairs, desks, to name a few
- Painting when needed (usually in the summer)
- Cutting and installing ceiling tiles (when needed)
- Breaking down cardboard boxes and taking it to recycle center (weekly basis)
- Cleaning folding chairs, tables, chairs in Sanctuary, glass doors in and around the Great Hall (as needed)
- Snow removal on Sunday mornings (when needed)

There are a lot more things that need to be done to help keep our property safe, clean, in working order, and welcoming to the congregation.

# **Cross of Hope Gardeners**



Our gardening team takes pride in keeping Cross of Hope clean, beautiful, and welcoming. Currently there are four members who meet on Friday mornings (weather permitting) to work outside and around the property. The Hope Gardeners take care of all landscaping outside and around the Church and School.

- We each take on an area to pull weeds, plant flowers, take care of shrubs and trees. These
  areas include the Kachina Street side of the building; the ditch next to the fire station; the area
  behind the sheds; the sidewalk area along Taylor Ranch Road in front of the Church; all the
  gravel areas around the building; the flower garden next to the south side of the building and the
  two circle gardens in front of the Church entrance.
- We pull weeds, trim roses, plants and shrubs around the church and school as well as cleaning
  up the shrubs in the parking lot median strips.
- Depending on the season the grass needs to be seeded, fertilized, and mowed.
- We rake and clean up the big garden (on the south side of the building) the two circle gardens in front of the church entrance and the newest garden, next to the fence also on the south side.
- In the spring, we plant flowers, fertilize plants and shrubs, and get everything ready for summer.
- Flowerpots are planted with either real flowers or silk flowers (if there isn't any water nearby).
- Summer maintenance is the time when we make sure weeks are pulled and everything is watered.
- Two of our members come to COH every couple of days to clean the parking lot if we had a storm and to rake the sand around the building.
- Sometimes we trim tree limbs and branches as needed.
- There is maintenance needed in and around the school playground such as weeding and sweeping up the sand from the sidewalks.
