Fall Festivities



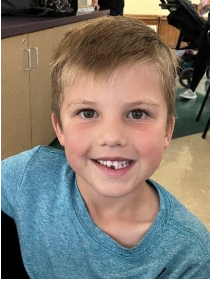

I'm also thankful for family's three dogs: mom's, dad's, and my brothers."

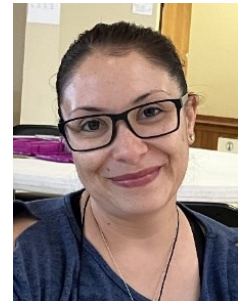

We have another treat! Having learned about our three new teachers in October's Rays of Hope, this month we will be introduced to our part-time teachers. They are a blessing that enriches our school. We are thrilled to have them as part of our Cross of Hope family.



Janessa is our music teacher. She is here every Friday morning. Susan Rivera, our director, recruited her. Janessa really enjoys COH - the community of teachers, staff and children. Being at a Christian school, she feels more love which anyone would think is great. At COH everything is done in love with Christ.

Julie oversees Cross of Hope's lunchroom. Julie was asked to run the lunch program, including the a hot lunch program. That was three years ago. The parents order from a health conscious and nutritious menu. Julie receives the hot food and makes sure each child gets what was ordered for him/her. Julie has two children here – one in pre-school and one in third grade. I would guess Julie will be with us for a while.



Leilani helps with the lunchroom. Like Julie, she is here every day. A neighbor suggested the Cross of Hope pre-school for her son. Next thing she knew she was asked to apply for a part-time job. With two children going to school here she plans on being here for a while. She "loves being with the kids. All the kids are kind. This is a kid-friendly, Christian place. All the volunteers are community-driven and kind."

Lisa is our library lady and art teacher for Kindergarten through second grades. Lisa learned about the part-time opening through Ms. Paula (see below). She retired from teaching in California and came to New Mexcio where she worked at APS for thirteen years. Lisa volunteered at COH vacation Bible school doing arts and crafts. She loved the church and felt like she belonged. She met Nancy Lacher and they hit it off. Nancy asked her to apply for a part-time position. Lisa loves staying active in her retirement and this has been a perfect opportunity. She is in the library on Monday and Wednesday and does art on Tuesday. Lisa said, "I will be back as long as I can. The kids are entertaining, and the adults are precious."



Meet MC (short for McMarshal). He is a Ph.D. student in PE at UNM. MC came to observe last year and was asked to take the part-time position. He is here every Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday afternoons.

MC has a bit of an accent. I asked him where it was from, he said Cape Town, South Africa. That said a lot to me having been there. If you are not aware, South Africans are crazy about sports. After high school MC got a scholarship in "running." Can you imagine, he turned it down? A couple years later he was approached with another "full-ride scholarship." This time he took it! He went to California Baptist University for his bachelor's and master's degrees. When it

As we enjoy the changing of the seasons, I marvel at how seamlessly the work of the Council flows with the new Church fiscal year and the start of the school year.

The Council welcomed Jessica Williams and Ron Cordova as newly elected members to the Council. We had a brief roundtable introduction period. Half of the Council members have been at Cross of Hope for decades, and three members have been at Cross of Hope for four or five years. It was interesting to note that all three newer members felt that the enthusiasm, hospitality and energy at Cross of Hope were the deciding factors in their choosing a new church home.

Overall, the financial health of both the Church and School remains solid, with expenses running slightly less than the budget and income holding close to projections.

The Council approved spending on new computing hardware to replace one server and a couple desktops that had passed their useful lives.

We discussed and approved a new laminator for the school.

The subject of new folding chairs was addressed. The need for the chairs has become more obvious with the overflow of people during recent memorial services. Several of the Church groups (Banner Babes and Women on Wednesday) have expressed an interest in helping with the funding. The Council voted to procure 54 new black folding chairs and a storage rack to bring our inventory to 150 folding chairs total.

The School Ministry Team continues to work on the accreditation processes for both the Preschool and Elementary School. Significant effort has gone into the planning and execution of the accreditation process. One hurdle on the horizon is the required audit leading up to the formal application. The School Ministry Team is still considering the timing of the two applications.

As an adjunct to the regular meeting, the Council toured the school facilities. As someone far beyond having youngsters of school age, I had not thought much about this part of the Cross of Hope ministry. I can honestly say that I was overwhelmed by the operation of both the Preschool and the Elementary School. The facilities are spotless, organized, and structured with safety in mind. The creativity and dedication of the teachers and volunteer support staff was evident at every turn. The classrooms were organized and set up for a stimulating learning experience. The layout of the facility showed a remarkable level of knowledge about a learning environment. I would invite everyone in the congregation to take a tour of the school, and you will see the great job being done there.

Advent - The Space Between

Advent – The Space Between is not intended to be descriptive of the season at the beginning of the church year typically assigned to the 4 weeks leading up to Christmas conveniently occupying the space between Thanksgiving and Christmas. It is most Profound. Advent is a season of the church year that invites us to step into, or at least gaze deeply at, the present time as the space between the promise of God's eternal reign set forth in Christ and the fulfillment of that promise at the end (or fullness) of time. You may have never noticed that the worship texts after All Saints Sunday often refer to the end of time. Even Sundays deep into the typical season of Advent only move to the beginning of the Christmas narrative the last Sunday or so before.

This year's theme carries us through the seven weeks between All Saints Sunday and the Eve of Christmas and invite us to reflect on the gift of the present moment as 'now and not yet' - the space between God's great revelation in Christ and the good news of 'Christ come again' in the fullness of time. We hope that this expanded season of Advent holds a blessing of space to wonder, marvel, and rejoice at the good news that Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again. Please join us as we reflect on our lives of faith in this space between.

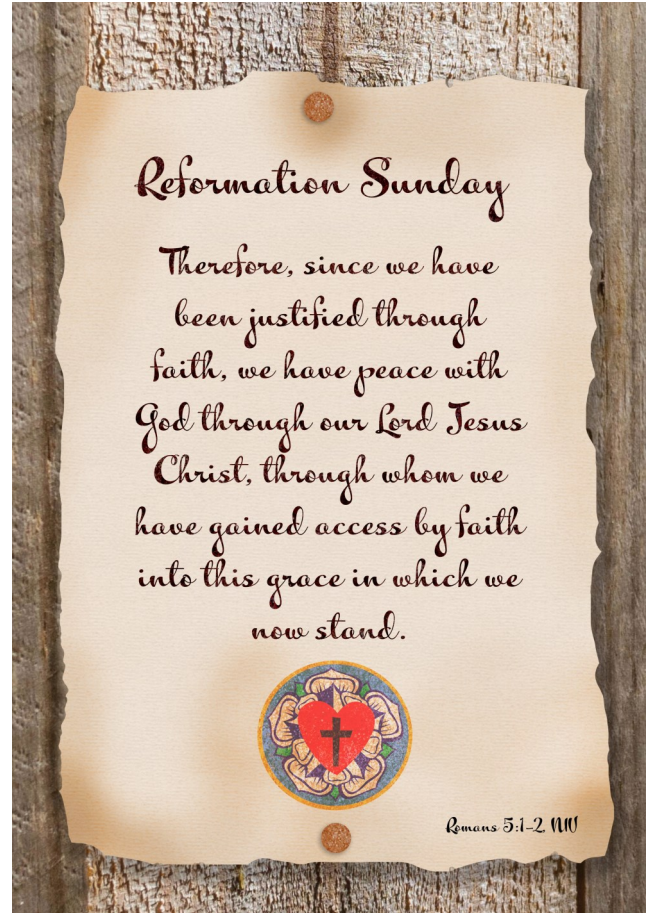

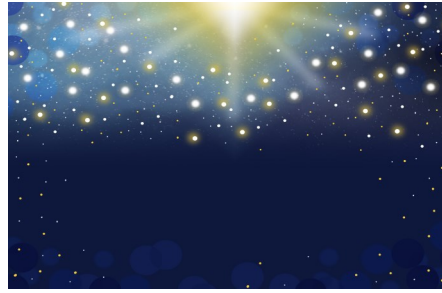

As We Move Closer to Election Day . . .

Our election cycle has been long and, perhaps for many, concerning and tiring. Let us pause for a moment and consider some inspiring words from **Kurt Rager, Director, Lutheran Advocacy Ministry-NM (LAM-NM)**.

As our ELCA Advocacy shares, "This church understands government as a means through which God works to preserve creation and build a more peaceful and just social order in a broken world. Our "civic participation is not simply voluntary, idealistic, or altruistic. The ELCA holds to the biblical idea that God calls God's people to be active citizens and to ensure that everyone benefits from the good of government (Jeremiah 29:7, Romans 13:1-7)."

LAM-NM has vigorously maintained a non-partisan stance in its work, choosing instead to make change through influencing policy through our advocacy and congregational organizing. We do not and cannot endorse candidates in elections. Yet, significant change can occur in policy through elections. . . . With each candidate seeking your vote, ask about their positions as they relate to our key areas of focus: hunger, poverty, the affordable housing crisis, and turning the tide on the growing population of those with no place to call home. . . . The list is long, but you get the idea. More simply put and spot-on, The **Most Rev. Michael Curry**, former presiding Bishop of the Episcopal Church, and a long partner in advocacy efforts with the ELCA, shares, "The principle on which Christians must vote is the principle: Does this look like love of neighbor?"
