Peter and Paul, Apostles

Today we celebrate two great figures of the early church, Peter and Paul, who represent the spread of the gospel to both Jews and Gentiles and, according to tradition, were martyred on this date. The witness of Peter and Paul inspires us as we seek ways to faithfully proclaim the gospel in our contemporary context.

"It is Well"

 When peace, like a river, attendeth my way, When sorrows like sea billows roll;
Whatever my lot, thou hast taught me to say, It is well, it is well with my soul.

I have always loved this hymn, and one Sunday morning when I had been called upon to write something lyric for the quartet, I went straight for "It Is Well". (I know... officially, it's "When Peace Like a River", but I've never remembered it that way.)

This arrangement pays heavy homage to Horatio Spafford and the circumstances under which he wrote the lyric for this hymn. Parts of the story as I heard it may be embellishments, but perhaps that doesn't really matter.

This arrangement opens with sounding of the horn of Spafford's ship as she passes over the point at which the SS Ville du Havre sank, taking his four daughters down with her. The first verse then builds dramatically as the lyric comes to Spafford, ending with the lovely chorus.

For the next section, I was actually thinking of the third stanza of the hymn. Spafford writes, "My sin, not the part, but the whole, is nailed to the cross..." The horn gets the melody, evoking the sound of Spafford's own voice, and the other instruments strike chords reminiscent of the hammering of the nails with which Spafford's sin is nailed to the cross. However, as Spafford moves into the chorus, the harmony becomes dark and uncertain as Spafford's grief overwhelms him; his faith wavers as he tearfully insists to himself that it is well with his soul.

Then, the melody transfers to the trumpet as Spafford is answered by the higher voice from above—his daughters assuring him that, yes, it IS well, it is well. The piece then ends with a peaceful statement of the chorus, evocative of the rolling sea and Spafford's soul at peace.
