God bless you this season of Lent as we journey through the cross to the empty tomb and commit ourselves again to the faithful love of God as we love and serve our neighbor.





Ahren our third grader said, "Love means loving and caring for each other. I give hugs to my parents and family. I help them when they are having problems and I offer my help."




Council Corner
